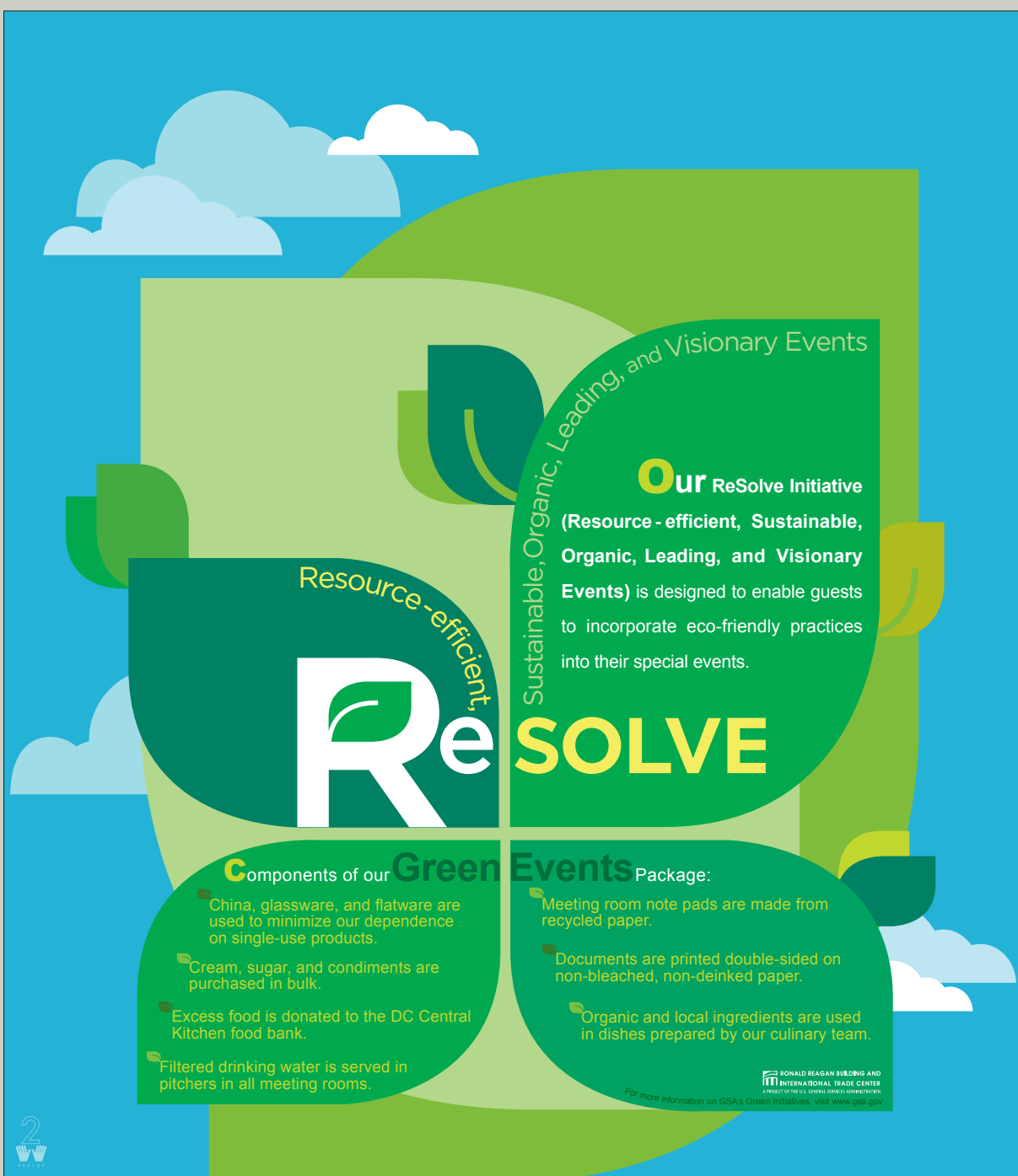

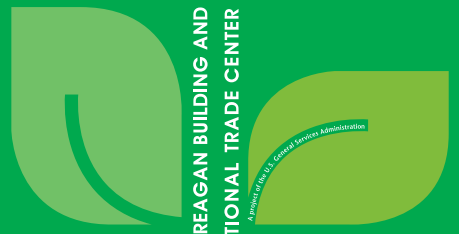

- Components of our Green Events Package:**
- China, glassware, and flatware are used to minimize our dependence on single-use products.
 - Cream, sugar, and condiments are purchased in bulk.
 - Excess food is donated to the DC Central Kitchen food bank.
 - Filtered drinking water is served in pitchers in all meeting rooms.
 - Meeting room note pads are made from recycled paper.
 - Documents are printed double-sided on non-bleached, non-deinked paper.
 - Organic and local ingredients are used in dishes prepared by our culinary team.
